## Sibley Sues Governor Cuomo Challenging Criminalization of Handgun Possession in the Home

## Judge <u>Ignores</u> Sibley's First Amendment Argument and Dismisses Sibley's Red Flag/FOIL Lawsuit

\*\*\*

CORNING, New York – Montgomery Blair Sibley's three-pronged blitzkrieg challenging New York's unconstitutional limitations on the right to bear arms for self-defense both inside and outside the home is advancing, albeit slowly, through the Courts.

First, an evidentiary hearing on Sibley's Application for a Pistol Permit License has been set for **Friday, January 10, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.** before Hearing Officer Chauncey Watches in Courtroom C, Steuben County Courthouse, Bath, N.Y. At the hearing, Sibley will be presenting evidence regarding his need for a concealed carry license based upon the threats to his life arising from: (i) his representation of the <u>D.C. Madam</u>, his possession of (and Vladimir Putin's interest in) her "Black Book" containing the names of Washington, D.C.'s elites, (ii) his lawsuits challenging Barack Obama's citizenship and (iii) the role of Presidential Candidate Joe Biden in the Larry Sinclair/Donald Young, (the murdered, openly gay choir director of Trinity United Church of Christ, Obama's now-former church) matter.

Second, Sibley has expanded his federal lawsuit seeking a declaration that New York's criminal ban on Sibley's handgun possession in his home <u>violates</u> Sibley's: (i) Fundamental rights and (ii) Second Amendment to the Federal Constitution rights by naming as Defendants (i) His Excellency Andrew Mark Cuomo, (ii) James L. Allard, Sheriff of Steuben County, New York, (iii) Brooks Baker, District Attorney of Steuben County, and (iv) Keith M. Corlett, Superintendent of the New York State Police. Last, in Sibley's Red Flag/FOIL Lawsuit seeking the release of Pistol Permit applications which are presently <u>forbidden</u> by New York Statutes, The Honorable Judge Wiggins entered his <u>Decision & Judgment</u> dismissing the lawsuit on **November 22, 2019**, holding: "As to Petitioner's

argument that the statute is unconstitutional as an infringement on his Second Amendment rights, the Constitutionality of the statute has been repeatedly upheld." However, Sibley did <u>not</u> argue that the limitations on release of Pistol Permit applications violated the Second Amendment. Rather, Sibley argued that it was the First, <u>not</u> the Second, Amendment which Sibley raised as mandating access to the Pistol Permit Applications. Sibley's <u>Motion to Reargue</u> is pending.
